

Peach Makes Its First Charter Flight “Aviation Class in the Sky” Held for Children who Will Lead the Next Generation of the Aviation Industry

- **Members of Kansai Aviation Boy Scouts were aboard the charter flight**
- **The two-hour flight out of Kansai Airport circled over the Seto Inland Sea, Kyushu, and Shikoku**
- **The pilot, flight crew, and operations department staff held an aviation class in the cabin**



Osaka Nov. 29, 2020 - Peach Aviation Limited (“Peach”, Representative Director and CEO: Takeaki Mori) took a charter flight, which was chartered by Kansai Aviation Boy Scouts. This is the first time that Peach has taken a charter flight since it began operations on March 1, 2012.

The initiative was sparked by a proposal from Kansai Aviation Boy Scouts to support Peach by chartering a flight. Kansai Aviation Boy Scouts has routine interactions with Peach through aviation classes, workplace observation, and more. The two-hour flight departed from Kansai Airport and flew over the Seto Inland Sea, Fukuoka, the border between Kumamoto and Kagoshima, and Shikoku’s Cape Ashizuri and Cape Muroto before returning to Kansai Airport.

In anticipation of the charter flight, a preparatory study group was held by aircraft dispatchers at Kansai Airport on November 18. They prepared a full-fledged program geared toward children aiming to join the airline industry, introducing them to aircraft dispatch work and providing them with an experience creating a flight plan for the actual charter flight they would take.

On the day of the flight, a total of 126 people were on board, including members of Kansai Aviation Boy Scouts and affiliates. Before taking off, staff from Kansai Airport and Peach introduced the infection countermeasures being taken at the airport, including checking temperatures, ensuring social distancing, and disinfecting check-in machines. Joining them on board were the pilot, flight crew, and aircraft dispatchers, who served as instructors of a “Aviation Class in the Sky,” in which they explained how to pilot and verified the geography on the flight route together.

With a priority on infection countermeasures, Peach will continue to promote business and offer various initiatives and services to our customers through a variety of touchpoints including our cabins, airports, and events, under the theme “Bridging Your Sky.”
