## Peach Introduces a Tool to Reinforce Safety for Credit Card Payments

## -Full-Scale Use of the "Decision Manager" Fraud Detection Tool Has Begun-

Osaka 15 March, 2019 – Peach Aviation Limited ("Peach"; Representative Director and CEO: Shinichi Inoue) announced that it has begun the full-scale use of "Decision Manager," a fraud detection tool offered by CyberSource KK ("CyberSource"; HQ: Tokyo; President: Seiji Yasubuchi), for airfare payments made on Peach's official website.

This tool will allow the airline to prevent fraudulent credit card transactions and provide an environment in which customers can purchase tickets with peace of mind on currently offered purchase channels (all channels including both computer and mobile sites).

Over 95% of airfares sold by Peach are purchased from the airline's website. Peach has always striven to reinforce security for credit card payments, conducting safe transactions with customers by using personal authentication and not retaining credit card information in the system.

By introducing the "Decision Manager" fraud detection tool at this time, the airline has further fortified its security and achieved a frictionless payment process for customers that is smooth and seamless.

By providing an environment in which customers can purchase tickets with peace of mind, Peach has further facilitated the demand for domestic and overseas travel while contributing to the realization of the cashless society being promoted by the Japanese government.
